Text - Psalm 17

Introduction

This is "a prayer of David"

Though many of the psalms are prayers, or contain prayers, there are only five that are designated as prayers: (Psalm 17, 86, 90, 102, 142)

This is also classified as a "lament". Here David is pouring out his heart to the Lord. (Psalm 3 was also a Psalm of lament of mourning)

It is believed that this Psalm was written when Saul was on the run from King Saul – which would put him at around 26 years old – approximately 1054 BC.

- I David's Pleads His Case Before God (vs. 1 5)
- II David Prays For God's Protection (vs. 6 9; 13 14)

vs. 8 the apple of the eye – the pupil – "keep your focus on me"

This phrase is used 5 times in the Bible, which we will see.

Three Things That God Is Focused On:

1 God's People - Israel

"For the LORD'S portion is his people; Jacob is the lot of his inheritance. He found him in a desert land, and in the waste howling wilderness; he led him about, he instructed him, he kept him as the apple of his eye."
(Deuteronomy 32:9-10)

"For thus saith the LORD of hosts; After the glory hath he sent me unto the nations which spoiled you: for he that toucheth you toucheth the apple of his eye." - (Zechariah 2:8)

2 God's Place - Jerusalem

"Their heart cried unto the Lord, O wall of the daughter of Zion, let tears run down like a river day and night: give thyself no rest; let not the apple of thine eye cease." - (Lamentations 2:18)

3 God's Precepts - The Word of God

"My son, keep my words, and lay up my commandments with thee. Keep my commandments, and live; and my law as the apple of thine eye." - (Proverbs 7:1-2)

- IV David Professes His Dependence In God (v. 15)
